

What services does your library already offer?

- We have staff members from a library branch near DWCF who go to talk about the library a few times a year.
- My boss and I facilitate a writing group in our local prison. As far as the prison is concerned, we are volunteers, but we do it on work time.
- My current library does not, but in Houston medical center we provided Consumer Health via mail
- JCPL goes 2 times a month to two County correctional facilities and one Federal prison; we host a writing workshop inside a women's re-entry facility two times each month.
- There is a library of some sort at our closest facility, and the coordinator from there comes over and we give her pre-packaged boxes of donated or discarded paperbacks (they can't have hardbacks). She comes every couple months to get what we have prepared.
- Our system just this last month is beginning to provide library cards to about-to-release patrons.
- Our Friends donate books.
- We are a mail order library and include incarcerated individuals
- Denver Public Library's Reference Department answers lots of postal mail reference questions from people that are incarcerated
- Our volume has exploded in the past year or so
- Our employee book swap books could go to our local jail
- Texas has a non-profit group that donates books to people in prison
- We actually get questions from around the country as we actually answer them
- I did booktalks in the Arapahoe County jail, and it was an awesome experience!
- Our writing group conversations are some of the best I have all month anywhere.
